#### **Privilege of the Floor**

If the Village has a debt load, the Villagers would have to cover that. Everyone would have to pay for the roads, Trout Ponds, library and maintenance on buildings. There was a lengthy discussion about the water district and about the

possibility of the Village dissolving. There will be adjustments if the Village does dissolve, but it is up to the Villagers to decide whether they want to dissolve or not, the Town has nothing to do with that.

Jared Martin asked the Board about joint services between the Town and the Village and there was a discussion on this issue.
