Privilege of the Floor

Gerald Shrauger addressed the Board with his concerns about Veteran's Exemptions. Mr. Shrauger would like the Board to name a dollar figure for exemptions. He asked for an explanation for the formula that is used. Mr. Lewis, Attorney to the Town and Supervisor Yetter addressed his concerns. After much discussion, Mr. Shrauger asked the Board to increase the exemption. Supervisor Yetter said the Board would discuss this matter further at a later date, but they have to keep in consideration that any increase places the burden on other taxpayers with limited incomes.

- **#1.** Gas Price: \$2.247 Diesel Price: \$2.349
- **#2.** Truck #82 had problems with over heating. We found small stones in the radiator fins, and the top over flow hose was leaking. We thought the radiator was leaking, but we checked the thermostat for the right opening temperature and found that is was not opening at 180 degrease but it was opening at 198 degrease. We change the thermostat and the hose for the over flow and put a screen on the front of the grill. It's OK now.
- **#3.** We finished the tires on truck #85 and now we are working on truck #89 tires.
- #4. We have been hauling in Sand from Lopke (Lounsberry Pit) Getting off Town Owego Bid at \$6.95 a Ton, better price than County Bid at \$8.50 a Ton if we haul, or \$12.00 a Ton if they haul in from Porter's. We took all we could from Universal Sand in Brooktondale @ \$5.00 a ton (Tompkins County Bid)
- #5. "Really" no Major Breakdowns. Truck #84 will have to go to Tri-City Spring shortly for a weak right front spring. (Wing side). Can't find a broken leaf just leaning.
- #6. We checked Goodrich's lifts and found stickers. Last inspected 5-09, which is done annually so it should work. Just rent 2 harness We will start the ceiling soon.
- **#7.** Last month Seneca Supply sent \$300. Toward the repair of the Brine Tank and received \$300. from Central Equipment. So the tank was repaired and paid for by the above. I turned the check over the Book Keeper (Cheryl) for deposit.
- **#8.** Tim Steed of Hawk Engineering called about water line replacement on Rock Street, around our Bridge. He will call back when He and Bill Foster can both be there. I told him to stay away from the Bridge Structure, and to fill the old water line with concrete so it wouldn't break and sag anything around the Bridge.

The Town Board and Superintendent Meade discussed the bridge structure and water line on Rock Street.

Superintendent Meade brought a "No Parking On Town Roads" sign to show all how they turned out. He stated that the signs were done and been posted. There are 21 signs at a cost of around \$900.00.

There was a discussion about the addition to the Highway Barn.

Superintendent Meade said the Tappan Road Bridge will be started in February or March. He talked about work that is needed to be done on Davis Hollow Road.

Supervisor Yetter complimented Supervisor Meade and the workers on how well they have been attending to the roads this winter and being cost conscious. They have done a great job.

Supervisor Yetter said he had received a few concerns and complaints about the highway workers plowing private citizen's driveways with Town equipment. He said that it is not allowed because it is a liability to the Town and the drivers can be held personally responsible. He then went on to explain when it would be allowed. A letter will be drafted to address this problem to the workers.

Superintendent Meade talked about the guardrails on Howard Hill being hit by a driver, but no one knowing who is responsible.
