## MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

This has been a good summer so far for the Town. The storms have been minimal and no significant damages. We have purchased a new Plow Truck and it is at the dealer being plow equipped. We were able to purchase this truck with some available state aid and avoid incurring any debt. The bid has been awarded for the new storage building, which we will pay for from our ARPA funds.

We are working with a NYSEG energy partner to convert our lights to new energy LED lighting in the Town Hall, Historian building and the Highway garage. This looks like it can be done at a minimal cost to the Town and will generate significant savings. We will soon be starting our budget process. With the cooperation of all the departments, I hope to keep my tax increase to a minimum.

- You will need to have the form signed by your doctor, bring the signed and dated form along with your driver's license.

#### **REGISTRAR MARRIAGE LICENSES**

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following:

FEE: \$40.00 - accepted forms of payment—cash, check or money order.

# Both bride and groom must be present for the application.

1. You must show proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license, passport)

2. You must have a Certified Birth Certificate with a raised seal for proof of birth, name, and age.

# Town Clerk–con'td

- 3. Social Security number.
- 4. Certified Divorce decrees from <u>all previous marriages</u>.
- 5. There is a 24 hours waiting period between purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.
- 6. The license is valid for 60 days.
- 7. The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

**NOTE**: You may apply for a marriage license in any Town or City office in New York State. If you choose to apply in Newark Valley, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

#### DOG LICENSING

If you own a dog and live in the Town or Village of Newark Valley, you are required to license your dog (s) -

- For new dogs: You must have a current Rabies certificate, if your dog is spayed or neutered, please provide a certificate so you can receive a discounted fee. You will receive a dog tag with the licenses, the tag is good for the life of the dog, both license and fee are non-transferrable.
- For renewal of license: you will receive a renewal notice when the license is due. You must have a current Rabies Certificate, a spayed or neutered certificate, if it applies

**Fees**: \$10.00 for a spayed/neutered dog, \$20.00 for a unspayed/ unneutered dog, (for a year license), \$3.00 dog tag replacement, if tag is lost. \$10.00 late fee per delinquent dog renewal.

You are able to get a new or renewed license by mail, please Mail to: Newark Valley Town Clerk, 109 Whig Street, Newark Valley, NY 13811.

All original paperwork, the licenses, and if needed, dog tag will be mailed to you.

After licensing your dog – should you move, change your contact information, the dog is missing, the dog been transferred to another individual or the dog is deceased - please contact the Newark Valley Town Clerk @ 607-642-8746 to update our records. *Lora Corson, Town Clerk* 



## DOG DATA

"Have you ever wondered if a particular household cleaning product or human medication is poisonous to your pets? The ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center (APCC) has provided the following guide for knowing which cleaning

products, human medications and cosmetic items to keep out of your pet's reach.

Please remember that this guide is for general information only and is not intended to help assess or manage animal exposures, or any subsequent time-sensitive medical issues. # HISTORIAN CORNER



The most valuable antique is an old friend. Lifelong learning about history helps our community progress into the future.

The beginnings of my research into local and family history began in Newark Valley in 1970. During the 1970s, I often met with the historians in the towns of Newark Valley, Berkshire, and Richford, especially when working on college papers in History. Wonderful experiences!

It is so great to be able to offer my services to this community in return for the benefits I had in growing up here. Certainly, all the same people are not here today. The community is here, as different as it is from what remains in my own memories of Newark Valley.

Ginny Mullen and her family were a part of my life when growing up here in Newark Valley, plus when our paths crossed in Florida.

At this time, I am concentrating on cleaning up the historian's desk, piled with paperwork, photos, and documents which have accumulated since the fall of 2022 when Ginny Mullen passed. There is still much more to be accomplished in the next few weeks.

We have two donations checked into our office. One was from John Howland, a history of the Onyx chapter of the Order of Eastern Stars of Newark Valley. The second donation was received from Sharon Weed, a Newark Valley High School yearbook. We thank both individuals plus any others who have given historical items to this office in the past and continuing into the future.

We can always use more help in this office. If you have 2 hours per week, or even per month, we'd appreciate assistance in organizing and caring for the materials in the history office. If you have some background in organizing records in libraries, offices, or schools, and are interested in providing community service for 1-2 hours per week or month, we would be happy to have you join us.

Besides being available when the history office is open (Wed., 2-4), you might find me at the Newark Valley Historical Society Depot concerts each Friday night until the end of August. At these events, food is served beginning at 5:30 and the concert follows at 7 PM. Would be glad to sit and chat about interests in Newark Valley history or any other interesting topics about Newark Valley.

We are at the history office Wednesdays, from 2–4 PM. We would be happy to meet with people at the office, located behind the NV Town Office at 109 Whig Street. Just a note from the Code Officer, Fall is approaching us, and if you are thinking about installing a wood stove, pellet stove or coal furnace, you will need a permit, and have it inspected by the Code Officer.

Decks, porches and small additions also need permits.

If you need a permit, you can visit our website at: www.townofnewarkvalley.com , go to Code Enforcement tab on the left side of the page, go to permits, and look for everything but manufactured homes, click on the application for building, will come up, print it out, and you can complete it and bring it to the Town Hall office.
