DOG LICENSES

If you own a dog and live in the Town or Village of Newark Valley:

You are required to license your dog (s). Your dog **must** have a license. In order to get a new dog licensed, you must have a current Rabies Certificate and the appropriate fee amount. If your dog is spayed or neutered, please provide a certificate, so you can get a discounted license fee. Please put the dog tag on the collar of your dog (highly recommended), if your dog gets lost, we will be able to identify the animal and owner easier. The tag is good for the life of the dog ; and just like the license, is non-transferrable. If the tag is lost, a new one can be issued for a charge of \$3.00.

You can get a new license or renew a license by <u>mail</u>. You will receive a renewal notice when the license is due. You will need:

*A current Rabies Certificate (all the required information about the dog and you should be on the Rabies Certificate, if not please provide the information)

*A spayed or neutered certificate, if it applies *A check or money order made out to the Town of Newark Valley in the amount of **\$10.00** for a spayed or neutered dog or **\$20.00** for an unspayed or unneutered dog for a year license *Mail to: Newark Valley Town Clerk, 109 Whig Street, Newark Valley, NY 13811 Get to know your Officials!

We will mail back all originals, the license, and if needed, a license tag. You can buy a one, two, or three year license as long as your rabies certificate doesn't expire before the license does.

If you no longer have your dog, if you change your phone number, or you have a change of address (even if you move to another town), please contact the Town Clerk's Office to update our records. Your cooperation is vital in keeping our records current.

Every month we have to generate delinquent dog notices and we do not like to send them any more than you like to receive them. The license fer check or cash

There is a \$10.00 late fee per delinquent dog. So...to avoid this, please update us on the status of your dog(s) and renew your dog license(s) promptly. Thank you.

HANDICAP PARKING FOR TOWN RESIDENTS

If you need a handicap parking tag, you need to get a form from us, or your doctor's office, have the doctor fill it out, fill out your part (both of you need to sign and date it) and bring it into our office along with your driver's license. You will then receive the permit. There is no cost to you. If you live in the Town of Newark Valley you must get your tag here. If you live in the village you must go to the village office.





REGISTRAR MARRIAGE LICENSES

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following:

The license fee is \$40.00, payable by check or cash

1. Both Bride and Groom must be present at time of the application.

2. You must show proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license, passport)

3. You must have a Certified Birth Certificate with a raised seal for proof of birth, name, and age.

4. Social Security number.

5. You must provide Certified Divorce decrees from <u>all previous mar-</u> riages.

6. There is a 24 hour waiting period between the purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.

7. The license is valid for 60 days.

8. The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

You may apply for a marriage license in any Town or City office in New York State. If you choose to apply in Newark Valley, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

REMINDERS – It's that time of year where the warm weather has moved more dogs outside. Please remember to ensure that your dog is continuously receiving sufficient food, water, shelter and exercise to coincide with the seasonal changes.

According to the Newark Valley Town Local Law - it shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog to allow a dog to be running at large as well as engage in habitual and sustained howling, barking, crying or whining as to unreasonably and habitually annoy any person. No one should expect a dog to always remain silent but there is an expectation that a dog should not become a nuisance to their neighbors.

Please remember to be respectful of your neighbors and often these situations can be resolved without negative reactions and legal action by discussing these concerns with them – even if it is via the assistance of the dog control officer. LOST/FOUND DOGS - please immediately contact the Newark Valley Dog Control Officer @ (607) 642-3287 OR (607)339-6566 for any potential sightings and sharing information. Keep in mind that most individuals that either retrieve a dog or are searching for their dog will contact the Dog Control Officer – so let's work together to bring these dogs home. AND please affix their ID tag to their collar for identification as well as it is mandated by the Newark Valley Town Local Law.

GREETINGS FROM THE NEWARK VALLEY FIRE DISTRICT

First, many people don't understand the difference between the NV Fire District and NV Fire Department. These are two separate organizations that work together to provide fire protection services.

The NV District is a geographic area comprised of our village, town, and small parts of the town of Owego. It is administered by five non-paid elected commissioners who are responsible to provide fire protection to those areas. This Fire District owns the fire station/hall, and apparatus (the red trucks), and most equipment. The Fire District is totally tax-funded, and as such we are always trying to balance the tax rate and fire safety and quality of service. The District works with the NV Fire Department to provide the manpower (people on the red trucks) and technical services.

The Fire Department is all volunteer and consists of the chiefs, officers, and firefighters. Our Fire Department is currently very well equipped, trained, organized, and functional, with very dedicated members who provide many hours of volunteer service. The N V District is very proud and supportive of the NVFD. Bear in mind that the quality and capacity of your Fire District is a factor in your home insurance rates.

In addition to fire fighting and rescue responsibilities, the Fire Department also functions as a social organization and includes activities such as Open House, parades, breakfasts, and fire prevention activities. The Department is a non-profit 503c organization and is totally funded by donations and various fund-raising events.

We, as most volunteer organizations, are always in need of additional members. Along with firefighters, we need members for Fire Police, Fire Auxiliary, and various talents and skills from people of all ages. The training and activities can be challenging, but usually fun and rewarding.

The Fire Department also rents their pavilion located at the Department training grounds (behind the station, across the tracks, off Marean Rd.)
