MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

Spring has arrived after a fairly easy winter for a change. Our budget for snow removal looks better than it has in several years. That being said our attention has been turned towards our plow trucks. Our fleet is aging out with a number of units nearly 20 years old or older. We have purchased one new truck paid for out of our capital reserve fund that should be delivered within a month. We are looking at options to perhaps buy one good used one to keep us going until we can afford to buy another new unit.

We are going out to bid for a new salt storage structure. The foundation has already been installed by the highway crew when road work was slow. This project will be paid for out of our building capital reserve fund.

We are also securing quotes to install a restroom and increase the usable space in the Historian's building. This project is almost totally funded by grants applied for by the Historians. This project has been needed for a number of years and will finally be accomplished with little property tax dollars.

HANDICAP PARKING

We will then fill the request from the application. There is no cost to you. You must live in Newark Valley to have this office issue you one. If you live in Newark Valley, you must get your tag here in Newark Valley.

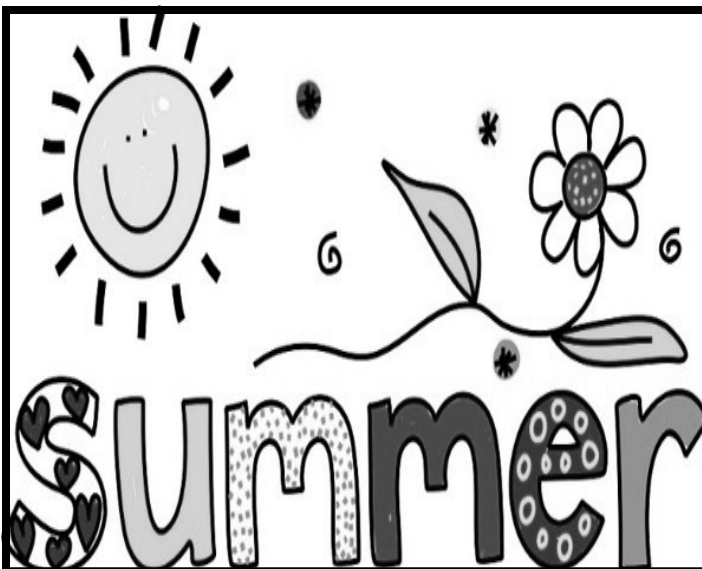
MARRIAGE LICENSES

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following:

1. Both Bride and Groom must be present at time of the application.
2. You must show proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license, passport)
3. You must have a Certified Birth Certificate with a raised seal for proof of birth, name, and age.
4. You must provide Certified Divorce decrees from all previous marriages.
5. There is a 24 hour waiting period between the purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.
6. The license is valid for only 60 days.
7. The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

The license fee is \$40.00, payable by check or cash.

You may apply for a marriage license in any town or city office in New York State. If you choose to apply in Newark Valley, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

DOG DATA

In this newsletter is the dog enumeration form. It is very important that every household responds to the requested information regardless of whether you actually own a dog or not. Please submit the attached form to the Newark Valley Town Hall by August 31, 2016. If this form is not returned, a home visit may be necessary by the Newark Valley Dog Control Officer to acquire this information.

Lost & Found Dogs - contact the Dog Control Officer immediately to ensure they are returned home quickly and before transport to Stray Haven needs to occur per state regulations.

Dear Village or Town of Newark Valley Resident:

The Dog Control Officer is conducting the annual census/enumeration of all the dogs living in the Village & Town of Newark Valley. It is very important that every household responds to the requested information regardless of whether you actually own a dog or not.

Licensing ensures that all dogs have been properly vaccinated against rabies for the protection of you, your family and your neighbors. After licensing your dog – should you move, change your contact information, the dog is missing, the dog been transferred to another individual or the dog is deceased, please contact the Newark Valley Dog Control @ (607) 642-3287 to update our records.

If you wish to submit a license/renewal at this time, please review the licensing requirements below. Keep in mind that if your dog is not licensed and if the dog tag is not properly affixed to their collar, you may receive a court appearance ticket which could result in a maximum fine of \$250.00. The dog tag on their collar has proven successful in getting your dog back home should they ever become lost as every dog that is picked up without an ID often ends up being taken to Stray Haven.

CODE COMMENTS

NYS Uniform Code and Energy Code Update

On March 9, 2016, the State Fire Prevention, Building Code Council completed major updates to the Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code and State Energy Conservation Construction Code (Energy Code).

There will be a transition period. Beginning on April 6th, regulated parties submitting a complete building permit application may comply with either the current Uniform Code or the newly adopted Uniform Code as described above. The transition period will last from April 6, 2016 until October 3, 2016. On October 3rd, the newly adopted Uniform Code will become fully effective.

Energy Code Effective Date – On October 3, 2016, the newly adopted Energy Code will become formally effective. There is no transition period for the Energy Code.
