#### DOG LICENSES

# If you own a dog and live in the Town or Village of Newark Valley:

You are required to license your dog(s). Your dog **must** have a license. In order to get a new dog licensed, you must have a current Rabies Certificate and the appropriate fee amount. If your dog is spayed or neutered, please provide a certificate, so you can get a discounted license fee. Please put the dog tag on the collar of your dog (highly recommended), if your dog gets lost, we will be able to identify the animal and owner easier. The tag is good for the life of the dog and just like the license is non-transferrable. If the tag is lost, a new one can be issued for a charge of \$3.00.

#### You can get a new license or renew a license by mail. You will receive a renewal notice when the license is due. You will need:

\* A current Rabies Certificate (all the required information about the dog and you should be on the Rabies Certificate, if not please provide the information)

\* A spayed or neutered certificate, if it applies

\* A check or money order made out to the Town of \*Newark Valley in the amount of **\$10.00** for a spayed or neutered dog or **\$20.00** for an unspayed or unneutered dog for a year license

\* Mail to: Newark Valley Town Clerk, 109 Whig Street, Newark Valley, NY 13811

We will mail back all originals, the license and if needed, a license tag. You can buy a one, two, or three year license as long as your rabies certificate doesn't expire before the license does.

If you no longer have your dog, if you change your phone number, or you have a change of address (even if you move to another town), please contact the Town Clerk's Office to update our records. Your cooperation is vital in keeping our records current.

#### HANDICAP PARKING FOR TOWN RESIDENTS ONLY

If you need a handicap parking tag, you need to get a form from us, or your doctor's office, have the doctor fill it out, fill out your part (both of you need to sign and date it) and bring it into our office along with your driver's license. We will then fill the request from the application. There is no cost to you. If you live in the Town of Newark Valley you must get your tag here. If you live in the village you must go to the village office.

#### REGISTRAR MARRIAGE LICENSES

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following:

License Fee is \$40.00, payable by check or cash.

1. Both Bride and Groom must be present at time of the application.

2. Proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license)

3. Certified Birth Certificate for proof of birth, name, and age.

4. Certified Divorce decrees from <u>all</u> previous marriages.

5. Social Security Number.

6. There is a 24 hour waiting period between the purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.

7. The license is valid for 60 days.

The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

You may apply for a marriage license in any Town or City office in New York State. If you choose to apply at the Town of Newark Valley office, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

If you need a copy of a birth, marriage, or death certificate, contact the office at 607-642-8746. You will need to fill out an application form. There is a \$10.00 charge for each copy.

Here at the Highway Dept. we have been sweeping the sand off the roads, cutting brush, cleaning ditches, replacing driveway and cross over pipes. Myself and the Town Board have slated 7 miles of roads (shimming bad spots and double coating with oil and stone.) The roads are; Lawrence Rd, Murphy Rd, Gage Rd, Harnecky Rd, Woodlawn Rd, King Hill Rd. Loomis Rd. Zimmer Rd. and back side of Howard Hill Rd. We have been re -working all gravel roads, and applying dust control and black top patch if needed. Hopefully, if time allows I want to start construction on Smokey Zimmer. Right now it's finding the time and money to begin this project. The gas prices are up, so is the highway emulsion oil along with the back-top. Any concerns please call 642-9927. Have a safe summer and please watch out for our work zone areas. Drive slow, stay off your phones and look ahead, my men want to see their families at night.

## **HISTORIAN CORNER**

#### OUR WATER WORKS

In 1901 a petition signed by 25 voters was presented to the Village Board to pay \$1000 to basically set up a water system for fire and safety purposes. No mention of health related issues! (Remember EVE-RYONE had a cesspool and a well at this time and the tannery runoff was ruining some wells).

The question then became: where was there a spring that could furnish a sufficient quantity of water? Members of the Board traveled the territory, by horseback and on foot, visiting every spring they could find. Finally, up the west valley near the northern boundary of the V.G. Saddlemire farm, (Shirley Rd), they found several springs promising a supply of water larger than anything else they had seen.

A contract was signed with a company that had just finished a system in Greene and also in Candor, for \$2700. Bonds were sold to raise the money. Cast iron pipes were ordered, a reservoir to hold 400,000 gallons of water was to be built of reinforced concrete. Work was completed, but not to satisfaction of the board, so they redid some of the pipes, after checking for leaks. The company lost money on this project, as the Board refused to pay for their extra work. In some sections, wooden pipes were used.

(Lena Bushnell told of the Italian immigrants digging the trenches for the pipes, by hand).

Requests for service came in faster than expected, and within a few years it was found that the springs could not furnish all the water needed.

In 1910, the voters authorized the expenditure of \$2500, to dig a well and equip the present pumping station (no longer used, located at Trout Ponds). Since then, a new reservoir has been built on the west hill, south of the village. In 2000 a new pump was installed at the Trout Ponds In 2010 this reservoir was demolished and a new one built in the same location. Also in 2009-10 70% of the pipes were replaced. The cost of all these improvements - approximately \$4 million dollars!
