DOG LICENSES

If you own a dog and live in the Town or Village of Newark Valley:

You are required to license your dog(s). Your dog **must** have a license. In order to get a new dog licensed, you must have a current Rabies Certificate and the appropriate fee amount. If your dog is spayed or neutered, please provide a certificate, so you can get a discounted license fee. Please put the dog tag on the collar of your dog (highly recommended), if your dog gets lost, we will be able to identify the animal and owner easier. The tag is good for the life of the dog and just like the license is non-transferrable. If the tag is lost, a new one can be issued for a charge of \$3.00.

You can get a new license or renew a license by mail. You will receive a renewal notice when the license is due. You will need:

*A current Rabies Certificate (all the required information about the dog and you should be on the Rabies Certificate, if not please provide the information)

*A spayed or neutered certificate, if it applies

*A check or money order made out to the Town of Newark Valley in the amount of **\$10.00** for a spayed or neutered dog or **\$20.00** for an unspayed or unneutered dog for a year license

*Mail to: Newark Valley Town Clerk, 109 Whig Street, Newark Valley, NY 13811

We will mail back all originals, the license, and if needed, a license tag. You can buy a one, two, or three year license as long as your rabies certificate doesn't expire before the license does.

If you no longer have your dog, if you change your phone number, or you have a change of address (even if you move to another town), please contact the Town Clerk's Office to update our records. Your cooperation is vital in keeping our records current.

Every month we have to generate delinquent dog notices and we do not like to send them any more than you like to receive them. So...to avoid this, please update us on the status of your dog(s) and renew your dog license(s) promptly. Thank you.

HANDICAP PARKING

If you need a handicap parking tag, you need to get a form from us, or your doctor's office, have the doctor fill it out, fill out your part (both of you need to sign and date it) and bring it into our office along with your driver's license. We will then fill the request from the application. There is no cost to you. If you live in the Town of Newark Valley you must get your tag here. If you live in the village you must go to the village office.

MARRIAGE LICENSES

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following: The license fee is \$40.00, payable by check or cash

1. Both Bride and Groom must be present at time of the application.

2. You must show proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license, passport)

3. You must have a Certified Birth Certificate with a raised seal for proof of birth, name, and age.

4. You must provide Certified Divorce decrees from <u>all</u> previous marriages.

5. There is a 24 hour waiting period between the purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.

6. The license is valid for 60 days.

7. The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

You may apply for a marriage license in any Town or City office in New York State. If you choose to apply in Newark Valley, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

CERTIFIED COPIES

If you need a copy of a marriage certificate, death certificate, or birth certificate, contact the office at 607-642-8746. You will need to fill out an application form. There is a \$10.00 charge for each copy.

NEWARK VALLEY ANNUAL SPRING CLEAN-UP DAYS

Town and Village of Newark Valley Residents:

The Town of Newark Valley will be conducting Spring Clean-up on Friday, May 4th and Saturday, May 5th. Items may be brought to the Town Hall, 109 Whig Street, and deposited in dumpsters at the rear of the property. Operating hours will be between 7:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. on both days. Residents 65 and over plus Town residents who are disabled and who wish to have their debris picked up on Thursday, May 3rd, must make an appointment no later than Monday, April 30, 2018, but not before April 2nd by calling the Town Highway Department at 642-9927 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.. Debris and/or brush to be picked up or dropped off will be limited to one pick-up truck load per household ONLY. More than one pick-up truck load will be left for the homeowner to properly dispose of. NOTE: Due to the new DEC No Burning Law we will not be taking wood. That means no construction wood of any kind i.e.; plywood, boards, 2x4's, 2x6's, etc. We will take brush no bigger than 4 inches in diameter at the cut off area to be run through the brush chipper. No debris from Towns outside of the Town of Newark Valley will be accepted. This year we will be taking tires as well, at a cost of \$2.00 per tire. Proof of residency is required at time of drop-off. All tires must be dropped off at the 109 Whig Street site. No tire pick-up will be offered during Senior pick-up day.

The following items WILL NOT be accepted:

Glass of any kind, paint cans or other hazardous waste containers, construction debris, shingles or tar paper, household garbage, batteries, recyclables or electronics*.

The following items WILL be accepted:

Old furniture, brush 4 inches or less in diameter, mattresses, plastics, scrap metal, and appliances (with doors removed).

PROTECTION OF DOGS

Tioga County has seen a recent increase in the reporting of potentially stolen dogs. It appears that dog control officers are receiving notification that the dogs were either outside on their owner's property controlled by an invisible fence, in an outside run or tethered otherwise. Many of these situations were posted on social media before their disappearance as being dogs that were left outside 24/7. For their safety, dog control is recommending that if your dog is outside to remain outside with your dog.

LOST/FOUND DOGS

If you have lost a dog - please contact the Newark Valley Dog Control Officer ASAP 24/7 @ (607) 642-3287. Often I am able to just offer my assistance by being a contact for any potential sightings and sharing information as you search for your dog. Keep in mind that most individuals that retrieve a lost dog contact the Dog Control Officer immediately - so let's bring your dog home quickly & safely before transport to Stray Haven has to happen. AND please remember to license your dog & affix their ID tag to their collar - especially in emergency situations this will allow for immediate identification and initiated contact of the owner - as well as it is mandated by the Newark Valley Town Local Law.

Where you put your house number?

Over time many of you have seen the value and wisdom of having clear 911 mailbox numbers on your mailbox or home. Here is the info on where to put the numbers:

- On the home located on the property. Facing the road. <u>If</u> the home is not clearly visible from the road then
- On the mailbox. Most people will, of course, put it on the mailbox anyway. A problem develops when mailboxes are grouped together. Emergency personnel, like police, fire, or ambulance might not be able to tell which number goes to which house. I hope you will evaluate your identification and make changes to ensure emergency personnel can find your home easily. If there is no mailbox as in if the home uses a post office box, then
- On a post. Place the post near the driveway.

You need a permit for:

A New Roof

A New Pool greater than 24"

Hot Tubs and Saunas

A Demolition

Any Change to a building structure

New Buildings and structures

New or Replace Decks/Porches

Stationary Emergency Generators And their wiring.

To install fireplaces, Chimneys,

And wood burning stoves, both Indoors and out.

For many signs

And More
