I would also like to welcome a couple of new faces here at the Town. We recently appointed Tim Dalton to fill the vacant seat on the Town Board opened by the untimely passing of Councilman Donald Thomas.

We also recently appointed a new Dog Control Officer to take over dog control and census duties. Denise Liske will be handling these duties now.

HUNTING & FISHING LICENSES

The State has a new system in place. It is much slower than the previous system, your patience will be greatly appreciated when you come in to get your license.

DOG LICENSES

The Town of Newark Valley requires you to license **all** dog(s). If you own a dog and live in the Town or Village of Newark Valley, your dog must have a license. In order to get a dog license, you must have a current Rabies Certificate and the appropriate fee amount (\$7.50 for spayed/neutered dog, \$15.50 for an unaltered dog). If your dog has been spayed or neutered, please provide a certificate, so you can get a discounted license fee. You can mail the information with a check or money order to us or stop by in person.

The license has to be renewed every year. Please make sure you provide your rabies certificate if the old one has expired, neutered certificate (if applicable) and sign the license. You can renew by mail. Just send everything in that is required, including your payment and we will send your license and certificates back to you.

If you no longer have a dog, please contact this office to update our records. Your cooperation is vital in keeping our records current.

(You can get a one, two, or three year license. License cannot exceed rabies certificate).

HANDICAP PARKING

If you need a handicap parking tag, you need to get a form from us, or your doctor's office, have the doctor fill it out, (both of you need to sign and date it) and bring it into our office along with your driver's license. We will then fill the request from the application. There is no cost to you. You must live in Newark Valley to have this office issue you one. If you live in Newark Valley, you must get your tag here in Newark Valley.

MARRIAGE LICENSES

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following:

License Fee is \$40.00, payable by check or cash.

- 1. Both Bride and Groom must be present at time of the application.
- 2. Proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license)
- 3. Certified Birth Certificate for proof of birth, name and age.
- 4. Certified Divorce decrees from all previous marriages.
- 5. There is a 24 hour waiting period between the purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.
- 6. The license is valid for only 60 days.

The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

You may apply for a marriage license in any town or city office in New York State. If you choose to apply in Newark Valley, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

Fall season safety tips

As the air turns cooler and leaves drop from the trees, it's important to keep a few important safety tips in mind. With proper precautions and safety awareness, your family can enjoy that crisp autumn whether while avoiding some of dangers that come with the season.

If you have not had your chimney swept in recent memory this is a good time to have a professional chimney sweep take care of this for you and your family. They key benefit will be to help insure that harmful carbon monoxide is safety removed from the home, but it will also help with the home heating bill. While you're at it, have your oil burner service and cleaned for peak efficiency additional cost saving alone with the safety benefits.

When using an electric heater, make sure it is (UL) listed and never us an extension cords because it might overheat and cause a fire, and never, ever cover the cord with a throw rug or anything else since this will also lead to overheating.

HIGHWAY HAPPINGS

I hope everybody got everything done that they wanted this summer! Here at the Highway all projects are complete and we started doing all gravel roads. The grader has lost reverse and 2 forward gears, but we hope to be back on the road soon. Also after the Bridge inspections this year, the beams on Ketchumville Road Bridge (Wilson Creek Side) didn't pass due to beam loss (salt corrosion). All beams will be changed with our men and Tioga County Bridge Maintenance Man. The bridge will be closed in September, but I don't know yet when because the beams have to be made. New York State D.O.T. stated that an engineer has to certify the beam size to be the same as or greater than to carry the weight going over the bridge. The last report I have, this bridge was built in the 1950's. We changed the deck once in the 1990's. We have a lot to do and a short time to get there! The detour route will be Dalton Hill and Lamb Road. I will put this in the Binghamton Press, Owego Penny saver, Tioga County Courier and various radio stations a few days before this happens. CODE COMMENTS

Building permits are very beneficial to you and your community.

By reading this you've already taken the first step toward increasing the investment value of your construction project and guarding against a lawsuit or injury. You'll be surprised at how easy the whole process is. By working with expert code officials, you will benefit from their knowledge of building codes to ensure your construction project is built right, safe, and will last.

WHAT'S A BUILDING PERMIT?

A building permit gives you legal permission to start construction of a building project in accordance with approved drawings and specifications.

WHEN DO YOU NEED A PERMIT?

The best way to find out if you need a permit is to call your local building department. Discuss your plans with the code official before beginning construction to determine whether you need a permit. Even if a permit is not needed, the code official will answer construction questions and may provide valuable advice.

WHEN WILL MOST PEOPLE NEED A PERMIT?

- New buildings
- Additions (bedrooms, family rooms, etc.)
- Residential work (decks, garages, fireplaces,


pools, saunas, larger sheds, roofs, etc.)

- Change of occupancy (from home to business)
- Electrical systems
- Plumbing systems
- HVAC (heating, ventilating, and airconditioning)

Your home or business is an investment. If your construction project does not comply with the codes adopted by your community, the value of your investment could be reduced. Property insurers may not cover work done without permits and inspections.

If you decide to sell a home or building that has had modifications without a permit, you may be required to tear down the addition, leave it unoccupied, or make costly repairs. A property owner who can show that code requirements were strictly and consistently met—as demonstrated by a code official's carefully maintained records—has a strong ally if something happens to trigger a potentially destructive lawsuit. Your permit also allows the code official to protect the public by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction and ensuring public health, safety, and welfare. By following code guidelines, the completed project will meet minimum standards of safety and will be less likely to cause injury to you, your family, your friends, or future owners.
