MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

Summer is winding down here at the Town Hall which means budget time is at hand. The Board and I are working hard to prepare a budget that will accomplish multiple things. If at all possible we would like to stay under the tax cap. That being said, it is also our responsibility to budget wisely enough so that the Town's assets and infrastructure are properly maintained so we do not have a fiscal disaster in the future. Our highway trucks are aging fast and a replacement program is being developed. Other pieces of large equipment are also starting to show signs of wear and tear. When a highway plow truck cost \$200,000 plus and an excavator can exceed a quarter of a million these are sizable expenditures. When you consider that a 1% increase in the tax levy only brings in approximately \$6300, it is easy to see the affect these purchases can have on the tax rate. We currently are doing everything possible to contain costs including cooperating with other Towns and even downsizing staff. Any ideas or suggestions that you as taxpayers may have, please forward them to me at any Board Meeting.

Another area in which the town could use some help from the public is volunteers to serve on a couple of boards. We currently have vacancies on the Board of Assessment Review and the Town Planning Board. If anyone has any interest in serving on these boards, call me anytime or email the Supervisors office for more information.

HUNTING & FISHING LICENSES

Doe permits are available now through October 1, 2015.

The office will also be open Saturday September 26 from 9AM to 12PM for hunting licenses.

If you find that you can't come to the office for your hunting license, you can get your license directly from NYSDEC- call <u>1-866-933-2257</u> or go to <u>www.dec.ny.gov/permits/6101.html</u>.

DOG LICENSES

The Town of Newark Valley requires you to license **all** dog (s). If you own a dog and live in the Town or Village of Newark Valley, your dog must have a license. In order to get a dog license, you must have a current Rabies Certificate and the appropriate fee amount (\$10.00 for spayed/ neutered dog, \$20.00 for an unaltered dog). If your dog has been spayed or neutered, please provide a certificate, so you can get a discounted license fee. You can mail the information with a check or money order to us or stop by in person.

The license has to be renewed every year. Please make sure you provide your rabies certificate if the old one has expired, neutered certificate (if applicable) and sign the license. You can renew by mail. Just send everything in that is required, including your payment and we will send your license and certificates back to you.

If you no longer have a dog, please contact this office to update our records. Your cooperation is vital in keeping our records current.

(You can get a one, two, or three year license. License cannot exceed rabies certificate).

HANDICAP PARKING

If you need a handicap parking tag, you need to get a form from us, or your doctor's office, have the doctor fill it out, (both of you need to sign and date it) and bring it into our office along with your driver's license. We will then fill the request from the application. There is no cost to you. You must live in Newark Valley to have this office issue you one. If you live in Newark Valley, you must get your tag here in Newark Valley.

MARRIAGE LICENSES

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following:

License Fee is \$40.00, payable by check or cash.

- 1. Both Bride and Groom must be present at time of the application.
- 2. Proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license)
- 3. Certified Birth Certificate for proof of birth, name and age.
- 4. Certified Divorce decrees from all previous marriages.
- 5. There is a 24 hour waiting period between the purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.
- 6. The license is valid for only 60 days.

The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

You may apply for a marriage license in any town or city office in New York State. If you choose to apply in Newark Valley, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

DOG DATA

TOWN OF NEWARK VALLEY DOG LICENSING LAWS

Please be sure to have the dogs on your premises timely & appropriately licensed. Court Appearance Tickets will continue to be issued for unlicensed dogs and delinquent dog licenses in the Town of Newark Valley. During the dog enumeration – it was discovered that there are some key points that one should be aware of related to dog licensing in the Town of Newark Valley:

- A dog of greater than 4 months of age must be licensed via the Newark Valley Town Clerk and/or when they have resided in the Town of Newark Valley for more than 30 days unless they are exempt pursuant to Agriculture and Markets Law §109. Proof of Current Rabies Vaccination is a necessity!
- Licensing Fees Effective 04/01/2015 - Spayed/Neutered \$10.00; Un-Spayed/Un-Neutered \$20.00; Kennel License \$50.00 + Spayed/Neutered \$1.00 & Un-Spayed/Un-Neutered \$3.00
- The Identification Tag provided by the Town of Newark Valley shall be affixed to that dog's collar at all times. Replacement Tag - \$3.00

FIRE MARSHAL

Q & A to the Fire Marshal

Q. We had a fire in our home and the insurance company wants the fire report. How do I get it?

A. A copy of the fire report is available from the Newark Valley Fire Chief by calling 642-9995 or calling the Fire Marshal's office 642-3617.

Q. I am opening a business and need to know the occupancy load for my business.

A. If you need to know the occupancy for a particular structure, contact the Town of Newark Valley Code Enforcement office 642-3617.

Q. If I am renting a house or apartment, who is responsible for installing and maintaining the smoke detectors?

A. If you are currently renting a house or apartment, the landlord is responsible for installing smoke detectors.

Q. I noticed that the tag on my fire extinguisher is expired. Will the Fire Department come out and service the Extinguisher?

A. The Newark valley Fire Department does not service fire extinguishers. You will have to call a Fire protection equipment and supplies for service.

Q. I live out of state and my mother and father are old, would the Fire Department come out to their home and check the smoke detectors for them?

A. Yes, Just call the Newark Valley Fire Department at 642-9995, or the Fire Marshal's Office at 642-3617.
