MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

Fall is here after one of the wettest summers in years. Here at the Town Hall, it's budget time and once again everyone is doing their best to keep cost down.

The challenge is that many of the products we use such as fuel, road oils and material such as stone and gravel are increasing in cost much higher than the rate of inflation. This makes staying in the 2% tax cap a real challenge. We also have the challenge of new equipment costs growing as well.

The Town has received a significant amount of COVID recovery money. The restrictions placed on this money are making it a challenge to utilize wisely in the Town, but we are working on that.

This fall we are looking at cutting our newsletter mailing to twice a year rather than quarterly. The post office has increased costs significantly for us to get this letter out to you. We plan to use the website for information at other times of the year.

Another issue facing the Town Board at this time, is the legalization of marijuana products. The Town has to make a decision regarding the ability to have sales of cannabis in the Town and also the ability of having a lounge for on premises consumption similar to a bar.

If the Town Board does nothing these activities will be allowed. The Board has the option to pass a Local Law to opt out of allowing this. If we opt out, the law can be repealed at a later date. If we do not opt out we can never opt out at a later date.

DOG LICENSES

If you own a dog and live in the Town or Village of Newark Valley:

You are required to license your dog(s). Your dog **must** have a license. In order to get a new dog licensed, you must have a current Rabies Certificate and the appropriate fee amount. If your dog is spayed or neutered, please provide a certificate, so you can get a discounted license fee. Please put the dog tag on the collar of your dog (highly recommended), if your dog gets lost, we will be able to identify the animal and owner easier. The tag is good for the life of the dog and just like the license is non-transferrable. If the tag is lost, a new one can be issued for a charge of \$3.00.

You can get a new license or renew a license by mail. You will receive a renewal notice when the license is due. You will need:

- A current Rabies Certificate (all the required information about the dog and you should be on the Rabies Certificate, if not please provide the information)
- * A spayed or neutered certificate, if it applies
- * A check or money order made out to the Town of Newark Valley in the amount of \$10.00 for a spayed or neutered dog or \$20.00 for an unspayed or unneutered dog for a year license

We will mail back all originals, the license and if needed, a license tag. You can buy a one, two, or three year license as long as your rabies certificate doesn't expire before the license does.

If you no longer have your dog, if you change your phone number, or you have a change of address (even if you move to another town), please contact the Town Clerk's Office to update our records. Your cooperation is vital in keeping our records current.

Every month we have to generate delinquent dog notices and we do not like to send them any more than you like to receive them. As of July 1, 2018, there is a \$10.00 late fee per delinquent dog license, to avoid this, please update us on the status of your dog(s) and renew your dog license(s) promptly. Thank you.

HANDICAP PARKING FOR TOWN RESIDENTS ONLY

If you need a handicap parking tag, you need to get a form from us, or your doctor's office, have the doctor fill it out, fill out your part (both of you need to sign and date it) and bring it into our office along with your driver's license. We will then fill the request from the application. There is no cost to you. If you live in the Town of Newark Valley you must get your tag here. If you live in the village you must go to the village office.

REGISTRAR MARRIAGE LICENSES

Getting married? If you plan to get a marriage license from us, please note the following:

License Fee is \$40.00, payable by check or cash.

- 1. Both Bride and Groom must be present at time of the application.
- 2. Proof of identity (driver's license, non driver's license)
- 3. Certified Birth Certificate for proof of birth, name, and age.
- 4. Social Security number.
- 5. Certified Divorce decrees from <u>all</u> previous marriages.
- 6. There is a 24 hour waiting period between the purchase of the license and the wedding ceremony.
- 7. The license is valid for 60 days.
- 8. The license has to be filed where it is purchased, not where the marriage takes place.

You may apply for a marriage license in any Town or City office in New York State. If you choose to apply at the Town of Newark Valley office, you must arrive one hour prior to this office closing.

If you need a copy of a birth, marriage, or death certificate, contact the office at 607-642-8746. You will need to fill out an application form. There is a \$10.00 charge for each copy.


HISTORIAN CORNER



Keep in mind that if your dog is not licensed and if the ID tag is not properly affixed to their collar, you may receive a court appearance ticket which could result in a maximum fine of \$250.00. The ID tag on their collar has been proven successful in getting your dog back home should they ever become lost - every dog that is picked up without an ID often ends up being taken to Stray Haven.

ADVANCE INFO for TAX TIME!

Newsletters will now only go out in Sept/March so this is advance notice of hours for 2022 collection. Hours will also be shown on your tax bill.

Tax payment collection hours for 2022 will be:

January 3rd – Feb 28th Mon thru Thurs 2-5 pm;

March, April & May - Tues & Wed only 2-5 pm.

Those wishing to pay early please call for amount and to arrange payment from Mon 12/27/21 – Thurs 12/30/21 between 2-5 pm.

If you do not receive your tax bill and your taxes are not paid by your mortgage company/bank please call in January so that one can be re-mailed or emailed to you or you can be given amount of bill over the phone.

Payment may be made by check, money order, or cash. Cards not accepted. Mail in payments are welcomed. Payment must be postmarked for month being paid.
